

<u>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</u> Explain the rules at home that you follow to ensure that you are safe. Discuss a goal you hope to achieve and how you will achieve it.	<u>Communication and Language</u> Follow a simple recipe. Dress up as your favourite character from your favourite book and retell the story.	<u>Physical Development</u> Build an obstacle course in your garden for your family to complete. Help your family hang up clothes on the washing line using pegs.	<u>Literacy</u> Explore reading a book in as many unusual places as possible. Draw a picture and write a caption for it using your phonic knowledge to describe it.
<u>Being Imaginative</u> Build a fort or den indoors using pillows and blankets. Have a cinema night and make tickets for your family to attend. 	<u>EYFS Home Learning</u> We value children's experiences both inside and outside of school. We do not expect you to complete them all but rather choose activities that engage your child and inspire learning! Set up a shop at home and challenge your family to pay for items.

Make a traditional tale puppet out of recycling and practise your cutting skills safely!	<u>Past and Present</u> Talk to your family about a new skill you have learnt since starting school. Ask a family member what games they played when they were a child. 	<u>People, Culture and Communities</u> Share a story with your child that describes a contrasting environment. Talk about a special celebration or event in your family.	<u>The Natural World</u> Go on a woodland walk with your family and hunt for animals in their habitats. Go for a walk with your family and see how many different plants you can learn the names of.
